2.3 Other hazards:	
Inhalation:	can cause respiratory irritation, coughing, shortness of breath, and systemic lead poisoning.
Ingestion:	can cause nausea, vomiting, abdominal pain, diarrhea, and severe systemic lead poisoning affecting the nervous system, kidneys, and blood.
Skin Contact:	can cause irritation, redness, and prolonged exposure may lead to absorption of toxic lead through the skin.
Eye contact:	can cause irritation, redness, watering, and potential damage to the cornea with prolonged or repeated exposure.

Chronic Exposure:	can cause accumulation of lead in the body, leading to neurological damage, kidney dysfunction, anemia, reproductive toxicity, and developmental effects in children.
Aggravation of pre-existing conditions:	can worsen pre-existing kidney, liver, or nervous system disorders, and may exacerbate cardiovascular problems or conditions related to lead sensitivity.

4.1 Description of first aid measures	
General information:
